

# Council Meeting Minutes

April 20, 2026

The City Council of Audubon Park held a meeting on Monday, April 20, 2026. The following were present Mayor Madeline Bozeman, City Clerk Cecilia Niemann, Councilors Austin Schwenker, Brenda Hartman, Joe Brenner, Joe Tronzo, Nicholas Abel, and Pete Becker.

## Call to Order

Mayor Bozeman called the meeting to order at 6:00PM.

## Public Comments

A member of the public inquired if and when a town hall meeting was scheduled. There are no plans for a town hall meeting this year. He commented on the roads, especially Eagle Pass.

## New Business

Mayor Bozeman introduced Councilor Brenner and Pete Hall's road review. Councilor Brenner reported on the issue. The Council held a discussion.

## Financial Report

Mayor Bozeman asked for a motion to bring the March Cash Flow and Budget to Actual to the floor. Councilor Schwenker made a motion; Councilor Hartman seconded. The Council reviewed the reports. All were in favor.

## Unfinished Business

Mayor Bozeman asked for a motion to bring the March meeting minutes to the floor. Councilor Brenner made a motion; Councilor Schwenker seconded. The Council reviewed the minutes. All were in favor.

## Code Enforcement Report

There was no report.

## Police Report

The Council reviewed the reports. No action was taken.

## Mayors Report

Mayor Bozeman would like to have plaques made for all the former mayors of Audubon Park.

The City's tree program was a success. Around fourteen (14) invoices were issued with payments already coming in.

Property tax rolls will be available Friday, the 24<sup>th</sup>. The City will remain within the four percent (4%) increase allowed by law.

The annual Dogwood Festival is on Friday, the 24<sup>th</sup>. A couple of vendors have cancelled leaving around fourteen (14) vendors. Pete Hall with Mayor Bozeman's Pride of Place Initiative will be set up near the fairy tree house selling miniature fairy trees.

The City of Audubon Park Foundation is officially a part of the Kroger Community Rewards Program.

Mayor Bozeman requested Council input on the possible establishment of a rental fee for large special events in the parks, such as weddings and receptions involving tents, dance floors, and catering. The matter will be addressed at a future meeting.

The Independence Day Parade will be held July 2<sup>nd</sup> celebrating the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the United States of America.

An ice cream social will be held sometime next month for summer break.

Four (4) property tax liens are still outstanding.

The Code Enforcement Board held a hearing on April 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Public Comments**


A member of the public offered an asphalt index to the Council for consideration when repairing the roads. He added that Amazon offers the same type of program as Kroger's Community Rewards, and the Foundation could consider registering with them as well. He inquired about the light poles in the city, whose responsibility it is to maintain them. The party responsible, LG&E, is six (6) months behind in their work.

A member of the public commented on Chief Murdoch's excellent ability in handling the individual behaving erratically on Audubon Parkway. He believes the stage will attract many events like the wedding previously mentioned, and the City should be prepared.
